Children's Belongings

In order to comply with the DfE guidelines and restrictions from the government to keep everyone safe, please send your child to school with **as little as possible**. Many children are still coming into school with large, empty rucksack. Please do not send your child with a big bag. Your child needs only their named water bottle and packed lunch (if they have one)

Due to the current situation our focus for PE has to be that all children are enjoying and engaging in PE lessons. On the day of your child's PE lesson we would like each child to come to school dressed in their PE uniform. It is important the PE kit is seen as an extension of our school uniform, therefore our high standards should be

maintained. As with all items of uniform please make ensure that all clothing is clearly marked with your child's name in the event that it is misplaced.

You should have received your child's PE day by text last Friday. Please contact the school office if you are not sure.



Social Distancing

Please respect the social distancing rules and one way systems that we have put into effect for the safety of our community.

Please also ensure that gates do not become cover crowed and obstructed.

Facemasks

The DfE has advised that <u>primary school</u>
<u>children</u> will not need to wear a face covering. This is because the approaches schools are putting in place will sufficiently reduce the risk in the classroom and also because they may have a negative impact on learning and teaching.

Hand sanitiser

There will be access to hand sanitiser at school so there is no need for children to bring in their own. If you still wish your child to use their own hand sanitiser this can be brought into school but must remain in the child's tray – it cannot go back and forth from school.

Communication

We have tried really hard to make sure we share with you all the latest guidance and changes in school in order for us to make sure we minimise the risks. Over the last few months we have used text messages, twitter, email, school website and also sent correspondence to families in the post. Can you believe we spent approximately a £100 in stamps over the last few months!

WHAT TO DO WHEN YOUR CHILD IS UNWELL?

THE MAIN SYMPTOMS OF CORONAVIRUS ARE:

A HIGH TEMPER ATURE:

When touching your chest or back, you are hot to the touch.





A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH

This means you have been coughing a lot more and if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual.

A LOSS OR CHANGE TO YOUR TASTE AND SMELL

This means you have noticed you cannot taste or smell things or they seem different to normal.



PLEASE DO NOT ATTEND SCHOOL IF YOU OR YOUR CHILD ARE DISPLAYING ANY OF THESE SYMPTOMS. ARRANGE A TEST AND INFORM THE SCHOOL OFFICE OF THE DATE OF TEST AND THEN THE RESULT OF THE TEST.

Getting a test

Call 119 and arrange a test if you or your child develops symptoms.

Inform the school office of the date of test and then the result of the test.

If the test is positive, follow guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection, and engage with the NHS Test and Trace process.

It is really important that you help St Charles to implement these actions by following the advice set out here and wider public health advice and guidance.
